4. Financial Report

4.1. 2021-22 Financials

- Dr. H. Gagné presented the year-end financial report.
 - o Revenue from membership and events for the 2021-22 fiscal year was \$35,000.
 - \circ Assets have increased from the previous year by ~\$20,000.
 - o Gift in-kind represents GOC financial support.
 - The biggest expense this year is for meetings and courses at \$29,325.
 - Closing the year with a net asset of \$27,605.

5.4. Bylaw Amendments

- Amendments to the Articles of Continuance of the Corporation to create a new class of non-voting members, which will be composed of individuals who are not practicing physicians.
- Amendments to the By-Laws of the Corporation to (i) remove restrictions on non-physicians being members and (ii) provide that the board of directors of the Corporation will be composed of at least 50% practicing physicians.

DISCUSSION: Why did the Board decide to allow 50/50 split of Class A vs. B on the Board if Class B members are non-voting members? "At least 50%" ensures we will always have a majority of colposcopists on the Board (Class A members) and be representative of the membership. Can we have one seat for a trainee and another or a nurse? We could, but not without a lawyer's assistance to amend the bylaws accordingly. Current wording provides more flexibility if we cannot find Class B members interested in joining the Board.

6.1. 2021-22 Recap



 - o With SCC, GOC and CPAC developed two upcoming national guidelines (HPV primary screening and Colposcopy guidelines)




7. Membership Report

8.1. Education in 2023

- Dr. N. Jumah summarized what is on the horizon next year in terms of Education.
 - SCC plans to develop a national accredited colposcopy course (basic and advanced; refresher) like what societies in other countries offer. Currently, such a course does not exist across the country.

DISCUSSION: We should incorporate a practical component to the course – it could be led by designated centres within provinces who are willing to host the training. We used to have hands-on workshops at the SOGC Annual Clinical Meeting. GOC's AGM Planning Committee wondered if SCC was interested in offering a short HPV/colposcopy workshop at GOC's AGM in June 2023.
